

Our March meeting will be Tuesday, March 6, 2018 at the Oakfield Government & Community Center. Our board meeting will be at 6:00 with our program at 7:00. This month Jeff Donahue will present "The Orphan Train". By the 1850s, large eastern U.S. cities had massive numbers of orphaned children. New York City alone had an estimated 30,000 children without parents, making placement with local families virtually impossible in a city of 500,000.

The orphan trains operated between 1854 and 1929, relocating about 200,000 orphaned, abandoned, or homeless children.
